RESPONDING TO IMMENSE NEEDS AT A GLOBAL SCALE

Over the past nine months, the Russia-Ukraine international armed conflict has caused innumerable deaths and injuries, and devastating damage to public infrastructure. Nearly one third of people have been forced to leave their homes. The Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement is supporting millions of people affected by the international armed conflict between Russia and Ukraine with food, clothing, hygiene supplies, cash and voucher assistance, health and care, including mental health support, first aid, child-friendly spaces, protection services and the restoration of family links.

Teams from ICRC and the Ukrainian Red Cross continue their emergency response work along the frontline, while the ICRC has facilitated thousands of communications between Prisoners of War and their families and ensured safe passage of thousands of civilians out of harm's way.

Through 40+ countries and National Societies, IFRC continues to strengthen coordination, providing critical support such as relief assistance and the largest emergency cash initiative in the history of the Movement.

Assistance with rehabilitation of houses/shelters, people accommodated in temporary collective/accommodation



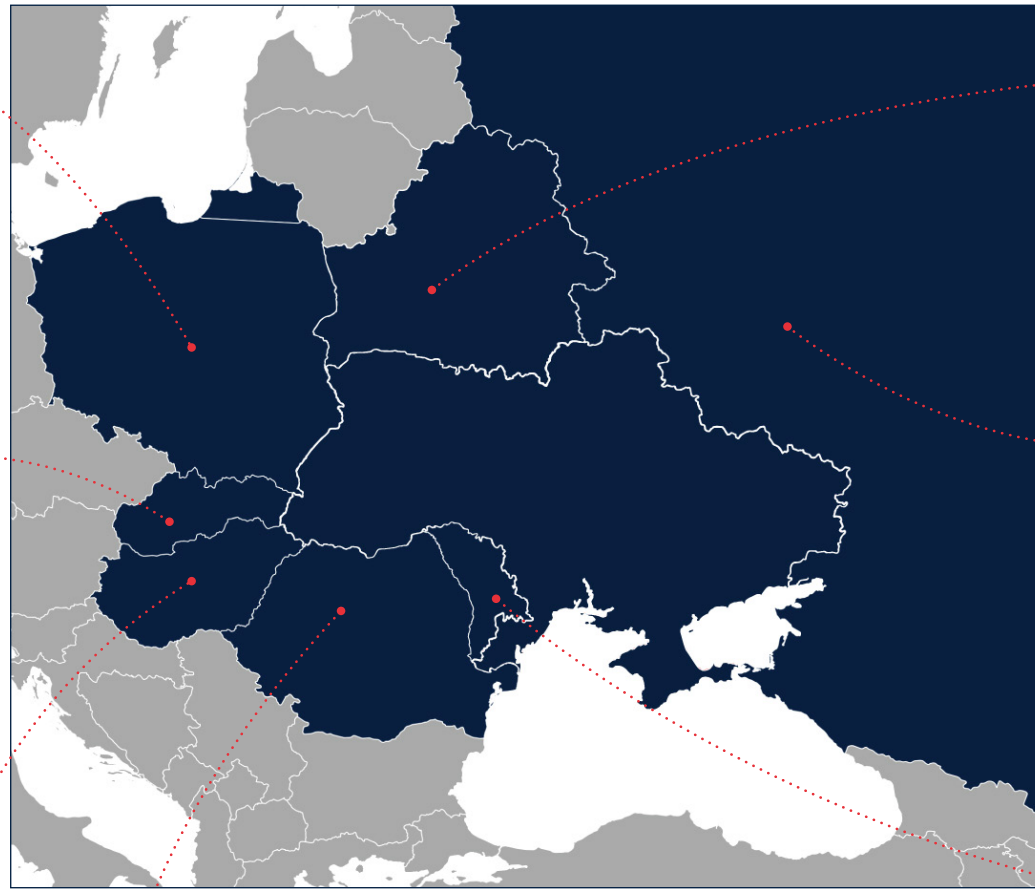

SPOTLIGHT ON UKRAINE

This winter millions of people will require humanitarian assistance to survive. Communities are facing the coldest months of the year with limited electricity, heat and water after attacks on critical infrastructure, and thousands of homes have been damaged or destroyed.

All components of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement – ICRC, IFRC, National Societies – are committed to reaching those in need. Thousands of volunteers from across the areas affected by the hostilities continue to work under extraordinary pressure to provide critical support to those affected.
